The learning log will demonstrate how you have refined your approach and working procedure in order to establish an emerging, contemporary visual art practice. The learning log will also describe how you have sought to develop meaningful relationships between your selected media, concepts, and production processes.

To complete assessment 2, you will be required to complete the Learning Log Worksheet template supplied (in Moodle) for this assessment.

In the learning log you will record your:

- · Fortnightly progress summaries.
- · Critical reflection on the work of relevant, established visual artists.
