You will explore types of communication and communication strategies that are relevant to different health contexts, including mental health. Oral, electronic, and written communication skills, including effective listening, therapeutic relationships, and the importance of cultural and diversity awareness when undertaking care, will be explained in this unit. In particular, you will examine your own strengths in communication and how you can utilise these to manage future clinical challenges. Throughout this unit, you will review the relationship between communication and professional conduct, reflecting on key components and considerations in nursing communication within the interdisciplinary health care team.
